Beaver County Victim Services is an organization of volunteers helping citizens of our community who have been victimized by crime or tragedy. Under the guidance and direction of the RCMP, they provide support during the first few critical hours after an incident. We offer follow-up support and will refer victims to community services as needed. Our services are free and confidential, available 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year.

As a Victim Services Advocate you will:

- **Gain valuable supervised volunteer work experience**
- **Have access to a wide range of professional development opportunities and Advocate Certification through the Solicitor General's Office**
- **Develop leadership and teamwork skills**
- **Be making a valuable contribution to your community**

Requirements to become a Victim Services Advocate:

- **Be a Canadian citizen or a landed immigrant**
- **Be 18 years of age**
- **Agree to a complete Security Clearance**
- **Meet the terms of the program which includes a minimum one year commitment, and a week long shift per month of "on call" duty**
- **Complete core online training**
- **Possess strong oral and written communication skills**
- **Maintain confidentiality pursuant to The Freedom of Information & Privacy Act**
