Highway 834 Bridge Load Restriction

Bridge over Amisk Creek on Highway 834 within Beaver County

Overview

Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors has implemented weight restrictions on the Amisk Creek Bridge, located on Highway 834, 7 km North of the Hamlet of Round Hill.

The bridge remains safe for travel within the posted weight limits. The current weight restrictions will allow the bridge to remain in service until an on-site detour bridge is installed.

Load Restriction Details

Maximum Load Limits:

Single Truck: 11 tonnes

Semi Truck and Trailer: 19 tonnes

Semi Truck Train: 25 tonnes

The bridge remains open for all traffic within the posted load limits. This includes, passenger vehicles, light trucks, emergency vehicles and semi trucks. Vehicles that exceed the posted load limits must use Highway 833 or other nearby Highways as an alternate route.

Additional warning and regulatory signage including, load restriction signs has been installed in advance of the bridge to notify drivers of the load restrictions. Notice of the weight restrictions is also posted and available on Alberta 511.

March 2025 Project Update

Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors is in nearing completion of the engineering design of a single lane on-site detour road and bridge, which will accommodate all legal loads without restrictions. Construction of the detour and bridge is expected to begin early May 2025 and take approximately one month to complete, weather permitting.

In addition to the on-site detour bridge, the design for the full bridge replacement is anticipated to be completed late spring 2025. The existing bridge structure will be replaced with new twin culverts. Construction expected to begin Summer 2025 with anticipated completion Fall 2025. The on site detour and bridge will remain in place until the new bridge structures are installed.


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Map showing the location of the Amisk Creek Bridge on Highway 834. Bridge photo below.



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
