The Subdivision and Development Regulations of the Municipal Government Act require that all new development permit applications must include the following:

An application for a development permit for a new building that will be larger than 47 square meters, or an addition to or an alteration of an existing building that will result in the building being larger than 47 square meters, must include:

- Information provided by the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) identifying the location or confirming the absence of any abandoned wells within the parcel on which the building is to be constructed, or, in the case of an addition, presently exists.
- This information can be obtained by either contacting the Alberta Energy Regulator Customer Contact Centre at 1-855-297-8311 (toll free) or using the GeoDiscover Alberta Map at: www.geodiscover.alberta.ca to confirm whether an abandoned well is located on your property.

If you do not have an abandoned well on your property you must fill out the above declaration and provide a copy of the map that was used to confirm the absence of abandoned wells on your property. This information must be included with your development application.

If you do have an abandoned well on your property, you will be required to meet the requirements as set out in AER's Directive 079.
